

Julie will attend the annual gathering of Baptist Women in Ministry and will participate in a panel discussion at Park Avenue Baptist Church on the subject of creating diverse and inclusive churches. I currently serve on the Board of the Baptist Joint Committee for Religious Liberty and will host our First Baptist table at the annual BJC luncheon on Friday. I'm also hosting the FBC table at the New Baptist Covenant luncheon on Thursday.
